What a year! As we reflect on the past fiscal calendar, July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024, a defining moment for our region was the awe-inspiring solar eclipse we witnessed together. Just as the sun and moon aligned to create an unforgettable collective experience for northeast Ohioans, so did Assembly focus its mission to unify and impact Cleveland's creative sector, advocating for resources, equity, and support for artists and cultural organizations alike.

In the pages of this annual report we spotlight some of the milestones. The photos reflect the incredible artists and programs that were part of the first cohort of the Creative Impact Fund. We highlight the impact of our advocacy with government partners, which led to the naming of a senior strategist in Cleveland City Hall and a \$3M investment in artist-led projects across the city. We participated in a national economic study, AEP6, that quantified the local dollars and jobs generated by the arts and culture industry. Our efforts with state and county officials led to ground-breaking legislation. It will allow Cuyahoga County voters the option to replace and grow a cigarette levy that could generate \$160M over 10 years for cultural nonprofits. And there's so much more.

These movements have led us to declare 2023-2024 as the Year of the Levy and the Year of Individual artists.

Public Support for Arts and Culture

Assembly and Cuyahoga County's arts and cultural community successfully advocated for permissive language to be added to the State of Ohio legislature. The language allows Cuyahoga County to ask its voters if they will increase a tax on cigarettes sold within its borders dedicated to support arts and culture.

Assembly partnered with Cuyahoga Arts & Culture (CAC) to redesign and relaunch the online resource and directory at **clevelandartsevents.com**. This public-private partnership is a unified effort to support nonprofits, artists, arts business, and the communities they serve to broaden and deepen their connections. Enhanced features include overall navigation, job and other opportunities, artist profiles, artist spaces and a cultural map.

Arts and Economic Prosperity 6 Study

For the first time, Cleveland was represented in the Arts & Economic Prosperity national study by Americans for the Arts. The results showed Cuyahoga County's nonprofit arts and culture industry generated at least \$533,156,171 in economic activity in 2022. That economic activity supported at least 8,637 jobs and generated \$104.2 million in local, state, and federal government revenue.

This important study has helped Assembly advocate for more resources devoted to arts and culture.

Artist Listening Campaign

We collected about **200 survey responses** and heard from **150 artists via 4 listening sessions** to generate insights to inform future funding programs.

This campaign was funded by CAC and The George Gund Foundation.

Assembly contracted with research firm ISO Arts Consulting, led by Dr. Brea Heidelberg to ensure objectivity.

key learnings

- Prioritize unrestricted funds and increase the amount awarded to each artist
- Increase overall support for artist funding by seeking sources beyond Cuyahoga Arts & Culture
- Create a central virtual space for finding grant opportunities, deadlines, and resources
- Simplify and streamline grant application processes
- Prioritize funding and resources for historically underrepresented or marginalized artists
- Increase opportunities for artists to be included in discussions or conversations about civic and social issues by facilitating connections between artists and civic leaders.
- Facilitate more artist listening sessions
- Establish an Artist Advisory Board





Transformative Arts Fund

Assembly supported the City of Cleveland in the review and panel process for \$3 million in project funds to transform Cleveland through public art. Grantees announced in July 2024.




